





- _____ 1. Used mainly for body work to avoid that “clipped down” look, this comb allows you to leave the coat a little longer than using just the clippers.
- _____ 2. Loose, dead hair will collect in the teeth of this grooming tool when used on long-hair breeds and breeds with dense coats.
- _____ 3. After trimming your dog’s nails, use this to smooth any sharp or rough edges.
- _____ 4. These nail trimmers have specially shaped cutting edges and use scissor action for a clean cut and good control for small dogs.
- _____ 5. Used for finishing, the tipped metal pins of this brush help groom and stimulate the skin.
- _____ 6. This general maintenance brush has pins that reach deep into the undercoat and bristles and detangle the undercoat.
- _____ 7. Used to clip the coats of dogs, these come in different styles, usually with detachable blades and snap-on combs.
- _____ 8. These popular nail trimmers cut through the nails quickly with their extra sharp blades and optimal leverage, holding the nail in place for excellent control.
- _____ 9. This grooming tool features a “safety stop” nail protector, plus a safety lock. The nonslip handles give you extra control while trimming your dog’s nails.
- _____ 10. Used to lift out dirt, dust, and dead hair from either short- or long-haired dogs, these flexible finger tips are great for grooming around legs, tail, and hard to reach places.
- _____ 11. With points rounded for safety, these are ideal to use to trim around your pet’s ears and face.
- _____ 12. Use these carefully when trimming your pet’s hair. The ends are sharp and could injure you or your dog.
- _____ 13. Use this to remove loose dead hair from dogs with short or fine coats. The teeth may also be used to trap fleas.
- _____ 14. These shears are used to thin and blend the dog’s coat, as well as to shape and finish the legs and lower part of the chest on certain breeds.
- _____ 15. This has a compact head and soft bristles to clean your dog’s teeth.
- _____ 16. Use this tool to remove mats and tangles from the coat. Working from the skin out, steadily rake through the coat, sectioning the hair in layers.
- _____ 17. Perfect for short-haired dogs, this pliable brush offers just the right degree of softness to remove dead hair and bring natural shine to the coat.
- _____ 18. One edge has coarse teeth and the other edge has fine teeth so you can remove dead hair, dried dirt and mud from either thick-coated or thin-coated breeds. The handle separates and converts to a two-handed open position which is great for grooming large dogs or removing excess water from your dog’s coat after bathing.
- _____ 19. This oblong-shaped brush with a handle has a dense setting of fine wire bristles that are helpful in removing loose hair, tangles, and debris from the coat.
- _____ 20. Put this on your finger for an easy way to clean your dog’s teeth.
- _____ 21. After your dog’s bath, use this to dry your dog prior to finishing with a hair dryer.
- _____ 22. This is used to keep a dog from removing bandages or sutures, or to prevent self-injury.
- _____ 23. Wet your dog prior to shampooing by pouring water from this. May also be used to help in rinsing the shampoo from your dog’s coat.
- _____ 24. Apply this with a cotton swab to quickly stop bleeding caused by trimming nails.
- _____ 25. Great for quick trips to the groomer or vet, this can also be used for house-breaking puppies. The bottom half can be used as a pet bed.
- _____ 26. Brush your dog’s teeth using this at least once a week. Human toothpaste tastes bad to your dog and can upset its stomach.
- _____ 27. This provides protection from aggressive, injured or fear-biting dogs. It safely allows the dog to slightly open its jaw, decreasing the chances of accidental choking.
- _____ 28. Connect this device to your faucet and use it to wet and rinse your dog.
- _____ 29. Used to dry dogs after bathing, this can be mounted to a cage or stand by itself on the table.
- _____ 30. Plugging the ears with these prior to bathing can keep water from entering a dog’s ear canals. Moistened, they can also be used to gently clean the inside of the ear flaps.
- _____ 31. Moisten this when applying styptic powder to stop bleeding caused by trimming nails.
- _____ 32. This is the ideal piece of equipment for grooming your dog. Fasten a grooming noose to the arm to secure the dog.
